COURSE OVERVIEW

The application of this unit in the workplace covers the performance of pole top rescue procedures as an emergency procedure. It specifies the mandatory requirements of rescue from a pole top and how they apply in the context of transmission, distribution and rail work functions. It encompasses responsibilities for rescue, health, safety and risk management processes at all operative levels and adherence to safety practices as part of the normal way of doing work.

This course is run from one of the best vertical and confined space rescue training facilities in Australia and is designed with focus on practical scenarios and assessments, as well as classroom-based theory delivery.



COURSE SUBJECTS

Prepare to perform pole top rescue

- Instruction in hazards and risk control measures for specific work functions and work areas are identified and obtained. (This will include the risk assessment and control measures taken by the individual performing the rescue).
- Tools and emergency equipment are checked for safety, functionality and placed in an accessible location to facilitate response and rescue according to established procedures.

Carry out pole top rescue

- Workplace procedures and work instructions for controlling risk are followed.
- Workplace procedures for accessing the pole top and removing the victim where necessary from contact with live apparatus.

- Workplace procedures for attaching the emergency lowering equipment and lowering the victim to the ground are followed.
- Workplace procedures for carrying out CPR, if required, at the site and treatment where necessary by medical professionals are followed.
- The worksite is secured and entry controlled until appropriate authorities inspect and release the site.

Complete pole top rescue procedure

- Processes for reporting accidents and/or incidents to authorised personnel are confirmed in accordance with established procedures.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Be at least 18 years of age (Photo Identification is required to be sited prior to course commencement.)
- USI Number
- Be fit and able to climb and crawl
- Not have a fear of heights or confined spaces
- Arrive in suitable clothing (long pants, closed-in shoes, long sleeve shirt)
- Language, literacy and numeracy skills required to interpret legislative requirements and to undertake written and practical assessment activities

- HLTAID001 Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation (obtained within 1 year)
